Lynn Lake is a full-service community that caters to all visitors' needs. The community is located in Northwestern Manitoba, approximately 1,100 kilometers from Winnipeg.

Lynn Lake is easy to get to. The Lynn Lake airport is your air entry point into Northwestern Manitoba. Fly in on a regularly scheduled flight, charter a plane, or book with an area lodge/outfitter and fly in using their plane. The Airport offers a 5,000 foot newly paved runway and our floatplane base is located just minutes away.

You can also drive to Lynn Lake through some spectacular landscape comprised of rugged Precambrian Shield and boreal forest.



The lakes surrounding Lynn Lake boast some of the best northern pike, walleye and lake trout fishing in the province.

Rugged wilderness in an untouched setting is home to abundant moose, black

bear, wolf and caribou. Geese, ducks, partridge and other small game are prolific.

Our area offers some of the most picturesque and spectacular lake and river systems in Canada! Lynn Lake is your gateway to canoeing adventures ranging from white water to tranquil and serene.

The **Seal and Kazan rivers** are famous among notable rivers in Canada. The **Cochrane and Dubawant Rivers** are also easily accessible from Lynn Lake and offer you the stuff that memories are made of.

The fish are plentiful in the Lynn Lake area.

First come the **walleye**: nowhere is the catch better than here. Expect to land fish that are the perfect eating size, and keep your eyes peeled for the trophy fish that come out of these lakes year-in and year-out.

The **trout** run a close second: there are lots of big lake trout all over the region. Speckled trout can also be found at **Gemmel Lake**, and you'll catch some gorgeous brown trout in the **Laurie River** system.

And don't forget the great predators—the **northern pike**. They're big and they're nasty with a healthy appetite. They'll give you the fight of your life.

Travel Manitoba has recognized trophy-winning catches of northern pike, walleye, lake trout, whitefish and brown trout from the Lynn Lake area. The area is also well-known for its plentiful stocks of grayling. For the fisherman or hunter, Lynn Lake is your passport to adventure.



A LAKE FOREVERY TASTE

The Lynn Lake region has a lake for everyone!

There are road-accessible lakes for fishers who want to get right into the action; powerboat-restricted lakes for those who enjoy quiet contemplation; remote, isolated lakes for those who don't mind crossing the backwoods to enjoy their privacy; and fly-in lakes for those looking for added excitement.

These are some of the more popular lakes that you might wish to visit during your stay in the region: **Eden Lake, Goldsand Lake, Vanderkerchove Lake, McMillan Lake, Motriuk Lake, Dunphy Lake, Cockeram Lake, Ralph Lake** and **Carswell Lake**.

Fish a different lake for a different species of fish each day! Fly-fish for trout one day, and the next day a spoon to entice a hungry northern pike. It's your choice.

If you love the great outdoors, then our two local Provincial Parks, **Burge Lake** and **Zed Lake**, will provide you with opportunities to be at one with nature. Both parks offer free camping and boat launch facilities.
