Once freed, the man was taken into police custody.

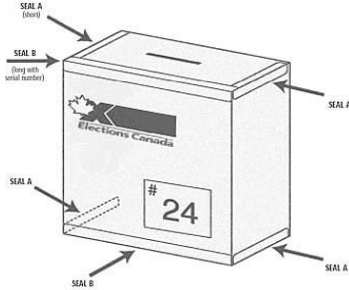

Has it been four years?

It's about that time again. The time when we, as a town and as a province, gather round our collective voting booths, check our boxes and hope for the best. On Oct 27, three memberships on the West Lynn Heights School Committee are up for grabs, as well as the four memberships on Town Council, and of course, the Mayor's seat.

Confusion began earlier in September, when it was found that candidates could not run for both School Committee and Town Council, resulting in two school committee candidates dropping out of the race. This has decreased the size of the School Committee ballot substantially, since now there are only four candidates running for the three spots available.

Perhaps the most interesting race is the one for Town Council. Only one of the incumbent council members will be re-



turning this year, creating a challenge for voters when making their deliberations. There are seven candidates in the running for the four positions available, making the race certainly more open than that of the School Committee.

In the Mayoral race, incumbent Audie Dulewich will be gunning for his sixth straight term as Mayor of Lynn Lake. Running against him will be David Campbell, current Town Councillor, Jeff Cockerill, owner of Halstead Motors, and Sean Maher, General Manager of

Northwest Communities Future Development Corporation.

Voting will be held on Oct 27 between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm at the Lynn Lake Centennial Library (503 Sherritt Ave). Advance polls will take place there between the same hours on Oct 20. Those who are unable to be present on those dates may apply to vote by mail. Those who wish to apply must write to the address below, between Sept 29 and Oct 20.

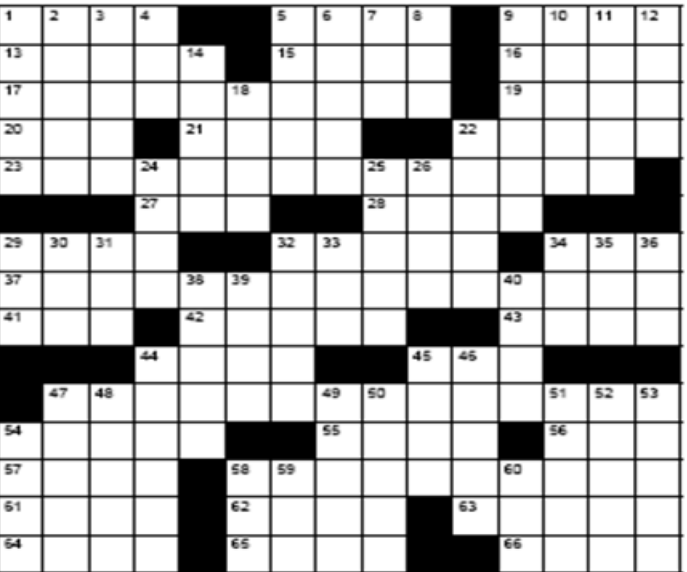

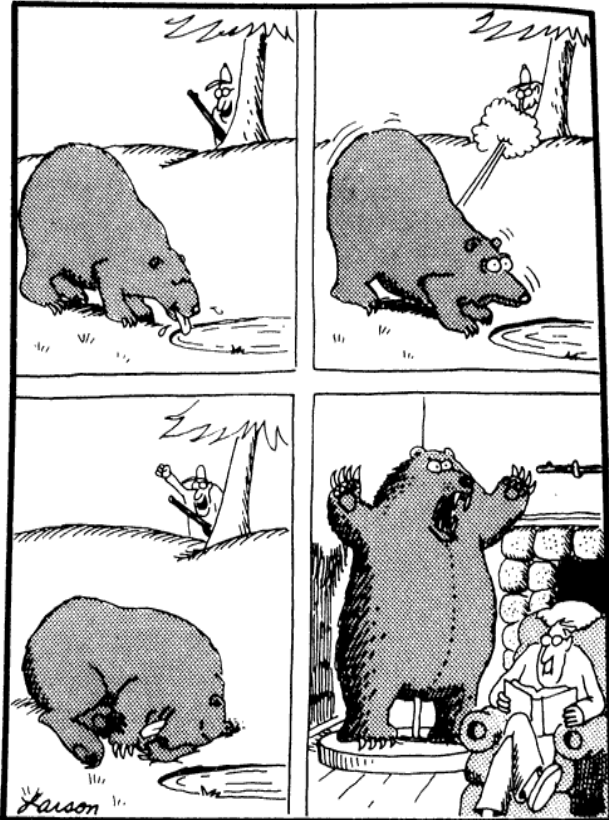

High-speed ahead!

For the first time in its history, citizens of Lynn Lake will have access to the type of high-speed internet that Southern Manitoba residents have been enjoying for over a decade now.

The project to bring broadband internet to town began only a few months ago when Floyd Buhler, Town of Lynn Lake CAO, frustrated with MTS's lack of interest in providing internet services to the area, decided to start his own internet business without them. Since acquiring the technology to make this happen, it didn't take long for things to take off from there.

Thus far just under two-dozen units have been installed in town, with a growing

waiting list of residents eager to try out the services for themselves. Unfortunately those residents will have to wait until the service can expand its bandwidth to accommodate the increasing traffic. Luckily, this expansion process should be complete within the coming weeks, which will allow many more residents to join in.
